EXCHANGE OF NOTES BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND AND THE GOVERNMENT OF YUGOSLAVIA REGARDING THE IMPORT OF BRITISH BOOKS INTO YUGOSLAVIA

Her Majesty's Ambassador at Belgrade to the Director of the Yugoslav Economic and Technical Assistance Administration

British Embassy,

Sir, Belgrade, December 31, 1955.

I have the honour to refer to the Exchanges of Notes of the 31st of December; 1953,(1) and the 31st of December; 1954,(2) between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Federal People's Republic of Yugoslavia regarding the import of British books and periodicals into Yugoslavia and to propose, on instructions from Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs:

- (a) that from the 1st of January, 1956, the sums of £900 per month and £200 per month hitherto made available by the Government of the United Kingdom for the purchase of scientific and technical books, artistic publications, English classical literature and English language teaching records and for the purchase of British scientific, technical and English teaching periodicals, respectively, shall be regarded as one allocation of £1,100 per month to be used for the purchase of books, gramophone records and periodicals as may be desired and on the understanding—
- (b) that the total sum allocated for the purchase of periodicals shall not, however, exceed £5,000 per year.

If the foregoing proposal is acceptable to the Government of the Federal People's Republic of Yugoslavia, I have the honour to suggest that the present Note and your reply in that sense shall be regarded as constituting an agreement between the two Governments in this matter.
