International Convention By a letter dated November 26, 1959, the Delegation of the Group of the different States and Territories represented by the French Overseas Postal and Telecommunication Agency to the Plenipotentiary Conference (Geneva, 1959) announced that the denomination of the Member of the Union "Group of the different States and Territories represented by the French Overseas Postal and Telecommunication Agency", should be replaced by "Overseas States of the French Community and French Overseas Territories". By a letter dated November 16, 1959, the Netherlands Delegation to the Plenipotentiary Conference (Geneva, 1959) announced that the denomination of the Member of the Union "Netherlands, Surinam, Netherlands Antilles, New Guinea" should be replaced by "Netherlands (Kingdom of the)". Delete asterisked footnote on page 2 of the Schedule. The above amendment was objected to within the prescribed period ending October 4, 1959, by the Government of Iceland.
