I have the honor to refer to the Exchange of Notes of January 30 and February 3, 1958,(<sup>1</sup>) relating to the sale of fruit and fruit products by the Government of the United States of America and the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, and to propose that the Exchange of Notes be amended as follows:

In paragraph 4 (a) of the Note add, "and 104 (k)" following "104 (a)." Also, add, "and for coordinated research against diseases." following "commodities."

If the foregoing proposal is acceptable to the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, this note and your note in reply thereto shall constitute an agreement between our two Governments to take effect on the date of your reply.
