EXCHANGE OF NOTES BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN FRELAND AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE FRENCH REPUBLIC AMENDING THE ROUTE SCHEDULES TO THE AIR TRANSPORT AGREEMENT, SIGNED ON FEBRUARY 28, 1946, AND AMENDED ON JANUARY 21, 1953

The French Minister for Foreign Affairs to Her Majesty's Ambassador at Paris

Ministère des Affaires Étrangères,

Monsieur l'Ambassadeur,

Paris, le 6 sept., 1961.

J'ai l'honneur de faire savoir à Votre Excellence qu'au cours des conversations qui se sont tenues à Londres du 24 au 31 mai dernier, les représentants des Autorités aéronautiques françaises et britanniques se sont mis d'accord sur un certain nombre d'amendements aux tableaux des routes figurant en annexe à l'accord relatif aux transports aériens entre les deux pays du 28 février 1946 modifié le 21 janvier 1953.

Il a été convenu que les amendements dont il s'agit devraient être confirmés, aussitôt que possible, par un échange de lettres diplomatiques.

Conformément à ces décisions, et d'ordre de mon Gouvernement, j'ai l'honneur de vous proposer le texte suivant :

### "Routes britanniques

Tableau III, Route 17, Colonne 3: Addition de la 'Corse'.

Beauvais Perpignan Brest Reims Caen Saint-Brieuc Calais Strasbourg Dijon Tarbes La Baule (Saint-Nazaire) Toulouse Montpellier Tours Nantes Vichy

### Routes françaises

#### Tableau I, Route 1, Colonne 2: Addition de:

Francfort ou Rome Tel Aviv Prague Téhéran Athènes Delhi Istamboul Bangkok

Tableau II, Addition de: Lydd.

Les adjonctions qui précèdent seront inscrites aux tableaux des routes de l'accord relatif aux transports aériens franco-britanniques du 28 fevrier 1946 modifié le 21 janvier 1953".

## [Translation of No. 1]

Ministry of Foreign Affairs,

Mr. Ambassador,

Paris, September 6, 1961.

I have the honour to inform Your Excellency that during the course of discussions between the representatives of the British and French aeronautical authorities in London from the 24th to the 31st of May last, agreement was reached on certain amendments to the route schedules annexed to the Air Transport Agreement between the two countries dated the 28th of February, 1946(1) and amended on the 21st of January, 1953(2).

It was agreed that these amendments should be confirmed, as soon as possible, by an exchange of letters through the diplomatic channel.

In accordance with these decisions and on the instructions of my Government 1 have the honour to propose the following text:—

#### " British Routes

Schedule III, Route 17, Column 3: Add 'Corsica'.

#### Schedule IV, add:

Beauvais Perpignan Brest Rheims Caen Saint-Brieuc Calais Strasbourg Diion Tarbes La Baule (St. Nazaire) Toulouse Montpellier Tours Nantes Vichy

#### French Routes

#### Schedule I, Route 1, Column 2: Add:

Frankfurt or Rome Tel Aviv
Prague Teheran
Athens Delhi
Istanbul Bangkok

Schedule II, add 'Lydd'.

The preceding additions will be included in the route schedules of the Anglo-French Air Transport Agreement of the 28th of February, 1946 amended the 21st of January, 1953".
