Her Majesty's Ambassador at Belgrade to the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs of the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia

Monsieur le Secrétaire d'Etat.

1 March, 1965.

I have the honour to refer to the Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia constituted by the Exchange of Notes of the 18th of December, 1963,(1) relating to the import of British books, films and other material of an educational and cultural nature and the acquisition of rights in such material.

I now have the honour to propose, under instructions from Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, that a further Agreement in the same terms and employing the same rate of exchange as set out in the Agreement constituted by the Exchange of Notes of the 12th of April, 1960,(2) as amended by the Exchange of Notes of the 24th of January/15th of February, 1961,(3) shall be deemed to have taken effect from the 1st of January, 1965, and continue in force for one year from that date unless terminated by either Government on two months' notice in writing to the other Government. If this proposal is acceptable to the Government of the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia I have also the honour to propose that this Note and your reply to that effect should constitute the further said Agreement between the two Governments in this matter.

I avail myself of this opportunity to renew to Your Excellency the assurance of my highest consideration.
