FROM HER MAJESTY'S GOVERNMENT IN THE UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND TO THE GOVERNMENTS OF BELGIUM, DENMARK, ICELAND, ITALY, LUXEMBOURG, THE NETHERLANDS, NORWAY, SAN MARINO, SWEDEN AND SWITZERLAND REIMPOSING THE VISA REQUIREMENT FOR THEIR RESPECTIVE NATIONALS TRAVELLING TO SOUTHERN RHODESIA

Your Excellency,

I have the honour to refer to the Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Kingdom of Denmark constituted by the Exchange of Notes dated the 20th of March, 1947,(1) concerning the reciprocal abolition of visas for travel between the United Kingdom and Denmark. By a Note addressed to the Danish Government on the 26th of October, 1948,(2) the Government of the United Kingdom extended the provisions of the Agreement to Danish subjects travelling to certain British oversea dependent territories, including Southern Rhodesia.

Circumstances have unfortunately arisen in Southern Rhodesia which necessitate the reimposition for the time being of the visa requirement for all foreign nationals proceeding to that territory. I therefore have to inform Your Excellency, with regret, that Danish subjects will now require visas for the purpose of travelling to Southern Rhodesia.

I request that Your Excellency will be so good as to acknowledge the receipt of this Note and to convey the foregoing information to the Danish Government.

I have the honour to refer to the Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Republic of San Marino constituted by the Exchange of Notes dated the 12th of September, 1949,(1) concerning the reciprocal abolition of visas for travel between San Marino and the United Kingdom and certain British oversea dependent territories, including Southern Rhodesia.

Circumstances have unfortunately arisen in Southern Rhodesia which necessitate the reimposition for the time being of the visa requirement for all foreign nationals proceeding to that territory. I therefore have to inform Your Excellency, with regret, that San Marino citizens will now require visas for the purpose of travelling to Southern Rhodesia.

I have the honour to request that Your Excellency will be so good as to acknowledge the receipt of this Note.

I have the honour to refer to the Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Kingdom of Belgium constituted by the Exchange of Notes dated the 1st of April, 1960,(1) concerning arrangements to facilitate travel between Belgium and the United Kingdom and certain British oversea dependent territories, including Southern Rhodesia.

Circumstances have unfortunately arisen in Southern Rhodesia which necessitate the reimposition for the time being of the visa requirement for all foreign nationals proceeding to that territory. I therefore have to inform you, with regret, that the Government of the United Kingdom, in accordance with paragraph 7 of the above Agreement, have been obliged to suspend the provisions of the Agreement temporarily in respect of Southern Rhodesia and that, in consequence, Belgian citizens travelling to that territory will now require visas.

I request that you will be so good as to acknowledge the receipt of this Note and to convey the foregoing information to the Belgian Government.
