GAB 52/3 Your Excellency. British High Commission, Gaberones, 1 December, 1967.

I have the honour to refer to recent discussions concerning the Public Officers (Botswana) Agreement, 1966(1) made between your Government and Her Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom and to record the agreement of our two Governments that the provisions of that Agreement shall not apply to, or in relation to, an officer in the Public Service of Botswana or other person who is or becomes a citizen of Botswana.

2. I should be grateful if you would acknowledge this letter and state that it correctly sets out the agreement reached between our two Governments.
