### EXCHANGE OF NOTES

BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND, ON BEHALF OF THE GOVERNMENT OF OATAR, AND THE UNITED NATIONS DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME EXTENDING TO OATAR CERTAIN TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE AGREEMENTS BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED KINGDOM AND THE UNITED NATIONS AND ITS SPECIALISED AGENCIES

Sir.

New York, 18 January, 1968

On instructions from Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, I have the honour to inform you that the Government of Qatar has requested that arrangements might be made whereby Oatar could make application for and, if granted, enjoy technical and other assistance under the Technical Assistance and Special Fund components of the United Nations Development Programme. I have the honour therefore to request you to extend to the Government of Oatar technical assistance facilities in accordance with the usual procedures.

In this connection I have the honour to propose that, in accordance with the desire of the Government of Qatar, the following Agreements shall be regarded as extended to Qatar, for the conduct of whose international relations the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland are responsible:

- (a) the Agreement signed at New York on 7 January, 1960 between the Government of the United Kingdom and the United Nations Special Fund concerning Assistance from the Special Fund:(1)
- (b) the Agreement signed at New York on 8 July, 1960 between the Government of the United Kingdom and the United Nations, certain Specialised Agencies of the United Nations and the International Atomic Energy Agency for the Provision of Technical Assistance to the Trust. Non-Self-Governing and other Territories for whose international relations the United Kingdom are responsible:(2) and
- (c) the Exchange of Notes signed at New York on 10 May, 1963 between the Government of the United Kingdom and the Technical Assistance Board of the United Nations(3) modifying the Agreement in (b) above.

If the foregoing proposal is acceptable to the United Nations, I have the honour to propose that this Note and your reply in that sense be regarded as constituting an agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom, acting on behalf of the Government of Qatar, and the United Nations and its Specialised Agencies.
