## EXCHANGE OF NOTES BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF IRELAND FURTHER AMENDING THE AIR SERVICES AGREEMENT OF 5 APRIL 1946

Your Excellency,

23 September, 1971.

I have the honour to refer to the Agreement between our two Governments relating to Air Services signed at London on 5 April, 1946(<sup>1</sup>), and subsequent Exchanges of Letters of 1947, 1948, 1951, 1952(<sup>2</sup>), 1956(<sup>3</sup>), 1958(<sup>4</sup>), 1959(<sup>5</sup>), 1960(<sup>6</sup>), 1961(<sup>7</sup>), 1964(<sup>8</sup>), 1965(<sup>9</sup>), 1966(<sup>10</sup>), April 1967(<sup>11</sup>) and July 1967(<sup>12</sup>), modifying the Agreement, as also to correspondence which has taken place between the aeronautical authorities of our respective Governments regarding the further modification of Schedule IV of the Annex to the Agreement.

In pursuance of this correspondence and of Article 8 of the Air Services Agreement the United Kingdom Government now proposes that the following modifications shall be made to Schedule IV—

For Route 11 there shall be substituted-

"11. Blackpool and/or Isle of Man-Dublin"

For Route 23 there shall be substituted-

"23. Glasgow and/or Isle of Man-Dublin"

If your Government agrees to the above proposals I suggest that this letter and your reply to that effect shall be regarded as constituting an Agreement between our two Governments.

Please accept, Your Excellency, the renewed assurance of my highest consideration.
