# The United Kingdom High Commissioner at Gaborone to the Vice-President and Minister of Finance and Development Planning of Botswana

British High Commission Gaborone 19 October 1978

Sir,

I have the honour to refer to the British Expatriates Supplementation (Botswana) Agreement 1976 (hereinafter referred to as "the Agreement") constituted by an Exchange of Notes dated 4 June 1976(<sup>1</sup>) between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Republic of Botswana and to discussions which have taken place between the Government of the United Kingdom and the Government of Botswana concerning the provision of assistance to staff in the service of the Institute of Development Management (IDM) and to place on record the agreement of our two Governments in that respect. The Government of the United Kingdom and the Government of Botswana agree, under the provision of paragraph 1 of the Agreement, to add the following to the list of employing authorities in the second Annex to that Agreement:

Institute of Development Management (IDM)

If this Note correctly sets out the terms that have been agreed I have the honour to propose that this Note and your reply in that sense shall constitute an Agreement between our two Governments which shall enter into force on the date of your reply and shall be cited as the British Expatriates Supplementation (Botswana) Agreement 1976 Amendment 1978.

I avail myself of this opportunity to renew to you Sir the assurances of my highest consideration.
