Your Excellency

I have the honour to refer to the Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Swiss Federal Council on the International Carriage of Goods by Road, signed at London on 20 December 1974⁽¹⁾ (hereinafter called "the Agreement"), and to the desire of the Principality of Liechtenstein to participate therein.

In view of the Customs Union Treaty between the Swiss Confederation and the Principality of Liechtenstein, after consultation with the Government of Liechtenstein I have the honour to propose on behalf of the Government of the United Kingdom that the provisions of the Agreement shall be regarded as applying to the Principality of Liechtenstein as they apply to the Swiss Confederation.

A Note in similar terms is being addressed to the Government of Liechtenstein⁽³⁾ and, if these proposals are acceptable to the Swiss Federal Council, I have the honour to suggest that this Note together with Your Excellency's reply thereto, and the reply from the Government of the Principality of Liechtenstein⁽³⁾, shall constitute an Agreement between the three Governments which shall enter into force on the date of the later reply, and shall remain in force as long as the Customs Union Treaty between Liechtenstein and the Swiss Confederation remains in force.

I avail myself of this opportunity to renew to Your Excellency the assurance of my highest consideration.

Your Highness,

I have the honour to refer to the Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Swiss Federal Council on the International Carriage of Goods by Road, signed at London on 20 December 1974⁽¹⁾ (hereinafter called "the Agreement"), a copy of which (with its accompanying Administrative Memorandum) is enclosed and to the desire of the Principality of Liechtenstein to participate therein.

In view of the Customs Union Treaty between the Swiss Federal Council. and the Principality of Liechtenstein, I have the honour to propose, on behalf of the Government of the United Kingdom, that the provisions of the Agreement shall be regarded as applying to the Principality of Liechtenstein as they apply to the Swiss Confederation. In addition the Government of the United Kingdom would wish to be advised in due course of the Liechtenstein competent authority for the purposes of Article 2, paragraph (4) of the Agreement.

Your Excellency,

I have the honour to refer to your note of February the 5th 1979 concerning the desire of the Principality of Liechtenstein to participate in the Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Swiss Federal Council on the International Carriage of Goods, signed at London on 20 December 1974 (hereinafter called "the Agreement").

On behalf of my Government I have the honour to notify you of its agreement to the proposal of the Government of the United Kingdom, that the provisions of the Agreement shall be regarded as applying to the Principality of Liechtenstein as they apply to the Swiss Confederation.

My Government has taken notice that a note in similar terms has been addressed to the Swiss Federal Council and is in agreement with your proposal. that your note of February the 5th, together with my answer of today and the reply of the Swiss Federal Council, shall constitute an Agreement between the three Governments which shall enter into force on the date of the later reply, and shall remain in force as long as the Customs Union between Liechtenstein and the Swiss Confederation remains in force.

The competent Liechtenstein Authority for the purposes of Article 2, paragraph (4) of the Agreement will be the Office of National Economy of the Government of the Principality.
