I have the honour to refer to the Exchange of Notes between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Republic of Zambia dated 31 March 1976⁽¹⁾, constituting the British Expatriates' Supplementation (Zambia) (Continuance) Agreement 1971-76 (hereinafter called "the Agreement"), and to the British Expatriates' Supplementation (Zambia) (Continuance) Agreement 1971-1976 (Amendment) 1976⁽²⁾ (hereinafter together called the British Expatriates' Supplementation (Zambia) Agreements 1971-1976), and to discussions which have taken place between our respective Governments concerning the employment of British staff by certain *Zambian parastatal organisations*.

The Government of the United Kingdom now propose that twenty-six *Zambian parastatal organisations* particularly defined in the Annex hereto should be added to the Second Annex of the Agreement.

If the proposal set out in this Note is acceptable to the Government of the Republic of Zambia, I have the honour to propose that this Note and your reply shall constitute an Agreement between our two Governments, amending the British Expatriates' Supplementation (Zambia) (Continuance) Agreement 1971/76, which should hereinafter be referred to as the British Expatriates' Supplementation (Zambia) Agreements 1971-1976 (Amendment) 1979 and which should enter into force on the date of your reply.
