# BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF IRELAND PROLONGING THE AGREEMENT ON THE INTERNATIONAL CARRIAGE OF GOODS BY ROAD, SIGNED AT DUBLIN ON 9 APRIL 1980

Her Majesty's Ambassador at Dublin to the Minister for Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Ireland

> British Embassy Dublin 4 July 1985

Sir,

I have the honour to refer to the Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Republic of Ireland on the International Carriage of Goods by Road, signed at Dublin on 9 April 1980(1), and to propose that, notwithstanding the provisions of Article 11 paragraph (2) thereof, the Agreement shall continue in force for a further period of five years from 1 July 1985, unless it is terminated by either Party giving six months notice thereof in writing to the other Party. Thereafter it shall continue in force if both Parties agree and for such further period as they specify.

If the foregoing proposal is acceptable to the Government of the Republic of Ireland, I have the honour to propose that this Note, together with your reply to that effect, shall constitute an Agreement between our two Governments which shall enter into force on the date of your reply.

I avail myself of this opportunity to renew to you, Sir, the assurance of my highest consideration.

## The Minister for Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Ireland to Her Majesty's Ambassador at Dublin

Your Excellency,

I have the honour to refer to the Agreement between our two Governments on the International Carriage of Goods by Road, signed at Dublin on 9 April 1980.

I have the honour to inform you that the Government of Ireland confirm that the Agreement shall continue in force for a further period of five years from 1 July 1985 unless it is terminated by either Party giving six months notice thereof in writing to the other Party, and that thereafter it shall continue in force if both Parties agree and for such further period as they specify.

The Government of Ireland also confirm that this Note, together with your Excellency's Note in similar terms of 4 July 1985, constitutes an Agreement between our two Governments which shall enter into force today.

I avail myself of this opportunity to renew to you, Excellency, the assurance of my highest consideration.
