BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THAILAND FURTHER AMENDING THE ROUTE SCHEDULE ANNEXED TO THE AIR SERVICES AGREEMENT SIGNED AT BANGKOK ON 10 NOVEMBER 1950

Your Excellency,

I have the honour to refer to the Air Services Agreement of 10 November 1950 between the Government of the Kingdom of Thailand and the Government of the United Kingdom, as amended¹, and to the discussions held in London from 28–29 November 1985 between the appropriate authorities of Thailand and the United Kingdom. In the course of these discussions, both parties agreed to revise the Route Schedule of the Air Services Agreement, as subsequently amended, and to replace it with the following Route Schedule:
