Sir:

I have the honor to refer to the Exchange of Notes constituting an Agreement between the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Multinational Force and Observers (MFO), of 17 March and 21 April 1982<sup>1</sup>, as subsequently extended by Exchanges of Notes of 12 and 19 April 1984<sup>2</sup>, 10 and 21 April 1986<sup>3</sup> and 22 April and 23 May 1988<sup>4</sup>, and related understandings.

The United Kingdom currently provides for the contribution of a headquarters company to the Organization. It undertakes an essential task in ensuring the success of the mission of the MFO in securing the peace, discharging its duties with a professionalism and reliability that legitimately should be the source of pride for your Government, as it is for the MFO.

In view of the foregoing and with the approval of the Governments of the Arab Republic of Egypt and the State of Israel, I have the honor of proposing that British participation in the MFO be continued, under the terms and conditions set forth in the above-referenced Agreement, for an additional period of one year commencing 21 April 1990. This participation shall continue under the same terms and conditions for a further period of one year commencing 21 April 1991, unless your Government informs the MFO at least 90 days prior to the expiry of the initial one year extension of the United Kingdom's intention to terminate its participation. Participation may be subsequently further extended by agreement.

The interpretative understandings related to the 1982 Agreement, expressed in a separate exchange of letters of 17 March and 21 April 1982<sup>1</sup>, shall remain in effect during the additional period of the United Kingdom's participation in the two-year period after 21 April 1990.

If the foregoing is agreeable to your Government, I propose that this Note, together with your reply to that effect, shall constitute an Agreement, which shall enter into force on the date of your reply.

I wish to take this opportunity to thank the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, on behalf of the MFO, for the valuable and dedicated service of the United Kingdom Contingent and the professionalism with which your contributed personnel have supported and continue to support the MFO.

Please accept the renewed assurances of my highest consideration.
