I have the honour to refer to the Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the International Lead and Zinc Study Group regarding the Headquarters of the Group, signed at London on 21 December 1978¹ (hereinafter referred to as "the Agreement").

- 2. I now have the honour to propose that a new Article be inserted in the Agreement after Article 9(2) as follows:
- "(3) The Group shall be accorded a refund of Insurance Premium Tax and Air Passenger Duty paid by the Group in the exercise of its official activities."
- 3. If the foregoing proposal is acceptable to the International Lead and Zinc Study Group, I have the honour to propose that this Note, together with your reply in that sense, shall constitute an Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the International Lead and Zinc Study Group which shall enter into force on the date on which the United Kingdom legislation giving effect to the amendment comes into force.
