EXCHANGE OF NOTES BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF ARMENIA TERMINATING THE TREATY ON MERCHANT NAVIGATION BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNION OF SOVIET SOCIALIST REPUBLICS, DONE AT LONDON ON 3 APRIL 1968, THE PROTOCOL TO THE TREATY, DONE AT MOSCOW ON 1 MARCH 1974, AND THE ADDITIONAL PROTOCOL, DONE AT MOSCOW ON 30 DECEMBER 1986

Her Britannic Majesty's Embassy at Yerevan to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Armenia.

Her Britannic Majesty's Embassy present their compliments to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Armenia and have the honour to refer to the Treaty on Merchant Navigation between the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics signed at London, 3 April 1968<sup>1</sup>; to the Protocol to the Treaty signed at Moscow, 1 March 1974<sup>2</sup>; and the Additional Protocol to the Treaty signed at Moscow, 30 December 1986<sup>3</sup>; which are currently in force between the United Kingdom and the Republic of Armenia.

In accordance with Article 17 of the Treaty, Article 5 of the Protocol and Article 6 of the Additional Protocol, the United Kingdom hereby notifies the Republic of Armenia with effect from 30 April 1998 of its desire to terminate the above agreements. The three agreements will therefore terminate on 29 April 1999, unless the United Kingdom and the Republic of Armenia agree to terminate them at an earlier date.

Her Britannic Majesty's Embassy avail themselves of this opportunity to renew to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Armenia the assurance of their highest consideration.

The Ministry would like to propose, that aforementioned Treaty and its Protocols will be terminated by the Exchange of Notes between the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland at an earlier date.

If the above is acceptable to the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland the Ministry proposes that this Note and Embassy's reply to that effect shall constitute an Agreement between our two Governments in this matter, which shall enter into force on the date of Embassy's reply.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Armenia avails itself of this opportunity to renew to the British Embassy the assurance of its highest consideration.

Her Britannic Majesty's Embassy presents their compliments to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Armenia and has the honour to refer to the Ministry's Note 16/04721 of 25 June 1998 concerning the Treaty on Merchant Navigation between the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics signed at London, 3 April 1968; the Protocol to the Treaty signed at Moscow, 1 March 1974; and the Additional Protocol to the Treaty signed at Moscow, 30 December 1986.

The Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland accepts the proposal in the Ministry's Note that the Ministry's Note and this reply constitute an Agreement between the Government of the Republic of Armenia and the Government of the United Kingdom<sup>1</sup> and Northern Ireland to terminate the aforementioned Treaty and Protocols with effect from the date of this Note.
