EXCHANGE OF NOTES BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF BANGLADESH AMENDING THE AIR SERVICES AGREEMENT DONE AT LONDON ON 5 JULY 1978

Her Majesty's High Commissioner at Dhaka to the Minister of Foreign Affairs of the People's Republic of Bangladesh.

British High Commission Dhaka

Excellency,
I have the honour to refer to the Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh for Air Services between and beyond their respective Territories, signed at London on 5 July 1978, ${ }^{1}$ ("the Agreement") and to subsequent discussions which took place between the representatives of British Airways and Biman Bangladesh Airlines. on 18 March 1997.

As a result of these discussions, the airlines have proposed that the Schedule to the Agreement should be amended by substituting for Schedule sections 1 and 2 thereof the Schedule sections 1 and 2 annexed to this Note.

This proposal is acceptable to the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland. If it is also acceptable to the Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, I have the honour to suggest that this Note together with its Annex and Your Excellency's Reply Note to that effect shall in accordance with Article 14 of the aforementioned Agreement constitute an agreement between our two Governments in this matter, which shall enter into force on the date of your Reply Note.

I avail myself of this opportunity to renew to Your Excellency the assurance of my highest consideration.

## SCHEDULE

## SECTION 1

Route to be operated by the designated airline of the United Kingdom: London/Manchester-Intermediate points-Dhaka-Points beyond except those in China, Japan and the USA.

## Notes:

(1) In both directions.
(2) The uplift and discharge of traffic at Dhaka shall be restricted to traffic to and from London and Manchester. Other traffic rights may be agreed between designated airlines and approved by the aeronautical authorities from time to time.
(3) Any point or points may be omitted on any or all flights provided that services begin in London or Manchester.

## SECTION 2

Route to be operated by the designated airline of Bangladesh: Dhaka-Intermediate points-London/Manchester-Points beyond to be agreed.

Notes:
(1) In both directions.
(2) The uplift and discharge of traffic at London and Manchester shall be restricted to traffic to and from Dhaka. Other traffic rights may be agreed between the designated airlines and approved by the aeronautical authorities from time to time.
(3) Any point or points may be omitted on any or all flights provided that services begin at Dhaka.
