The A483 Trunk Road (Various
Locations between Builth Wells and
Newtown, Powys) (Temporary
Traffic Restrictions & Prohibition)
Order 2011

Made 20 June 2011

Coming into force 1 July 2011

The Welsh Ministers, being the traffic authority for the relevant length of the Swansea – Manchester Trunk Road (A483) (hereinafter referred to as “the trunk road”), are satisfied that traffic in specified lengths of the trunk road should be restricted or prohibited by reason of works being executed thereon.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1) and of all other enabling powers(2), make this Order.

1. This Order comes into force on 1 July 2011 and its title is The A483 Trunk Road (Various Locations between Builth Wells and Newtown, Powys) (Temporary Traffic Restrictions & Prohibition) Order 2011.

2. —(1) In this Order:

“the lengths of the trunk road” (“*y darnau o’r gefnffordd*”) means those lengths of the A483 trunk road between Builth Wells and Newtown in the County of Powys specified in the Schedule to this Order;

“works period” (“*cyfnod y gwaith*”) means the period commencing at 08:00 hours on 1 July 2011 and ending when the temporary traffic signs are permanently removed.

(2) Any reference in this Order to a numbered article or Schedule is a reference to the article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.

3. Subject to the provisions of article 7, no person shall, during the works period, drive or cause or permit any vehicle to proceed at a speed exceeding 40 miles per hour in the lengths of the trunk road.

4. Subject to the provisions of article 7, no person shall, during the works period, drive or cause or permit any vehicle to proceed at a speed exceeding 30 miles per hour in the lengths of the trunk road.

5. Subject to the provisions of article 7, no person shall, during the works period, drive or cause or permit any vehicle to proceed at a speed exceeding 10 miles per hour in the lengths of the trunk road.

6. Subject to the provisions of article 7, no person shall, during the works period, use or permit the use of a vehicle in such a way that it overtakes any other vehicle in the lengths of the trunk road during such times as the restriction referred to in article 5 is in operation.

7. The provisions of articles 3, 4, 5 and 6 apply only during such times and to such extent as the application of the restrictions and prohibition referred to therein is indicated by traffic signs.

8. The maximum duration of this Order shall be 6 months.

SCHEDULE

Cefn Bronllys, Llanddewi Ystradenni

The length of the trunk road that extends from a point 346 metres south of the centre-point of its junction with the access road to Bron Efail to a point 228 metres north of the said junction.

Disserth Mill, Nr. Howey

The length of the trunk road that extends from a point 373 metres south of the centre-point of its junction with the C1233 to a point 144 metres north of the said junction.

Wye Cottage, Llanelwedd

The length of the trunk road that extends from a point 178 metres south of the centre-point of its junction with the access road to Wye Cottage to a point 120 metres north of the centre-point of its junction with Club Lane.

Quarry Bends, Llanelwedd

The length of the trunk road that extends from a point 72 metres north of the centre-point of its junction with the A481 to a point 622 metres north of the said junction.
