**ROAD TRAFFIC, WALES**

**The A5 Trunk Road (Llangollen,  
Denbighshire) (Temporary 40 mph  
Speed Limit) Order 2016**

*Made* 9 May 2016

*Coming into force* 13 May 2016

The Welsh Ministers, being the traffic authority for the relevant length of the London – Holyhead Trunk Road (A5) (“the trunk road”), are satisfied that traffic in a specified length of the trunk road should be restricted because of the likelihood of a danger to the public on or near the road.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1), (4) and (7) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1) and of all other enabling powers(2), make this Order.

**Title, Interpretation and Commencement**

**1.** This Order comes into force on 13 May 2016 and its title is The A5 Trunk Road (Llangollen, Denbighshire) (Temporary 40 mph Speed Limit) Order 2016.

**2.**—(1) In this Order:

“exempted vehicle” (“*cerbyd esempt*”) means:

(a) any vehicle being used by the emergency services; and

(b) any vehicle being used for naval, military or air force purposes and are being driven by a person for the time being subject to the orders of the member of the armed forces of the Crown, who is a member of the special forces—

- (i) in response, or for practice in responding, to a national security emergency by a person who has been trained in driving at high speeds; or
- (ii) for the purpose of training a person in driving vehicles at high speeds;

“special forces” (“*lluoedd arbennig*”) means those units of the armed forces the maintenance of whose capabilities is the responsibility of the Director of Special Forces or which are for the time being subject to the operational command of that Director;

“the length of the trunk road” (“*y darn o’r gefnffordd*”) means the length of the trunk road at Llangollen in the County of Denbighshire that extends from a point approximately 30 metres east of the eastern end of Birch Terrace, Queen Street to a point approximately 50 metres east of its junction with the access road leading to Ty’n-y-Wern Hotel.

(2) Any reference in this Order to a numbered article is a reference to the article bearing that number in this Order.

### **Restriction**

3. Subject to the provisions of article 5, no person shall drive or cause or permit any vehicle to proceed at a speed exceeding 40 miles per hour in the length of the trunk road.

### **Suspension**

4. Any statutory provisions restricting the speed of vehicles on the relevant length of the trunk road specified in article 2 are suspended during such times as the restriction specified in article 3 is in operation.

### **Application**

5. (1) The provisions of article 3 apply only during such times and to such extent as the application of the restriction referred to therein is indicated by traffic signs.

(2) No speed limit imposed by this Order applies to an exempted vehicle.

### **Duration of this Order**

6. The maximum duration of this Order shall be 18 months.
