The Welsh Ministers make the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by section 66(2) of the Agricultural Holdings Act 1986(1).

Title, application and commencement

1.—(1) The title of these Regulations is the Agriculture (Calculation of Value for Compensation) (Revocations) (Wales) Regulations 2019.

- (2) These Regulations apply in relation to Wales.
- (3) These Regulations come into force on 1 November 2019.

Revocations

2. The following Regulations are revoked—

- (a) the Agriculture (Calculation of Value for Compensation) Regulations 1978(2);
- (b) the Agriculture (Calculation of Value for Compensation) (Amendment) Regulations 1980(**3**);
- (c) the Agriculture (Calculation of Value for Compensation) (Amendment) Regulations 1981(4);

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations revoke the Agriculture (Calculation of Value for Compensation) Regulations 1978 in Wales and three instruments that amended those Regulations.
