# The National Health Service (Dental Charges) (Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2019

Made - - - - 5 March 2019

The Welsh Ministers make the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 125 and 203(9) and (10) of the National Health Service (Wales) Act 2006(1).

#### Title and commencement

1. The title of these Regulations is the National Health Service (Dental Charges) (Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2019 and they come into force on 1 April 2019.

# Amendment to the National Health Service (Dental Charges) (Wales) Regulations 2006

- **2.** In regulation 4 of the National Health Service (Dental Charges) (Wales) Regulations 2006(**2**) (calculation of charges)—
  - (a) in paragraph (1), for "£14.00" substitute "£14.30";
  - (b) in paragraph (2), for "£45.00" substitute "£46.00";
  - (c) in paragraph (3), for "£195.00" substitute "£199.10";
  - (d) in paragraph (4), for "£195.00" substitute "£199.10"; and
  - (e) in paragraph (5), for "£14.00" substitute "£14.30".

## Revocations

- 3. The following Regulations are revoked—
  - (a) The National Health Service (Dental Charges) (Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2017(3);

## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations amend the National Health Service (Dental Charges) (Wales) Regulations 2006 (S.I. 2006/491 (W. 60)) ("the 2006 Regulations").

Regulation 2 amends regulation 4 of the 2006 Regulations (calculation of charges) by increasing the applicable charge payable for a Band 1, a Band 2 and a Band 3 course of treatment.

The Welsh Ministers' Code of Practice on the carrying out of Regulatory Impact Assessments was considered in relation to these Regulations. As a result, it was not considered necessary to carry out a regulatory impact assessment as to the likely costs and benefits of complying with these Regulations.
