**The A470 Trunk Road (Llanrwst,
Conwy) (Temporary Prohibition of
Vehicles, Cyclists and Pedestrians)
Order 2023**

Made 23 March 2023

Coming into force 1 April 2023

The Welsh Ministers, as traffic authority for the relevant length of the A470 trunk road, are satisfied that traffic on a specified length of the trunk road should be prohibited because of works proposed on or near the road and likelihood of danger to the public during potential flooding incidents.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1), make this Order.

Title and commencement

1. The title of this Order is the A470 Trunk Road (Llanrwst, Conwy) (Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles, Cyclists and Pedestrians) Order 2023 and this Order comes into force on 1 April 2023.

Interpretation

2. In this Order—

“the trunk road” (“*y gefnffordd*”) means the length of the A470 Maentwrog to East of Conwy trunk road that extends in a south-easterly direction from the south-eastern parapet of Pont Fawr at its

junction with the B5106, for a distance of 20 metres;

“works period” (“*cyfnod y gwaith*”) means the period commencing at 00:01 hours on 1 April 2023 and ending when the temporary traffic signs are permanently removed.

Prohibitions

3. No person may, during the works period, drive any vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, on the length of the trunk road.

4. No person may, during the works period, ride any pedal cycle on the length of the trunk road.

5. No pedestrian may, during the works period, proceed on the length of the trunk road.

Application

6. The prohibitions in articles 3, 4 and 5 apply only during such times and to such extent as indicated by traffic signs.

Duration of this Order

7. The maximum duration of this Order is 18 months.
