ROAD TRAFFIC, WALES

The A40 Trunk Road (Llandovery, Carmarthenshire to Trecastle, Powys) (Temporary Traffic Prohibitions & Restrictions) Order 2023

Made 26 May 2023

Coming into force 6 June 2023

The Welsh Ministers, as traffic authority for the A40 trunk road, are satisfied that traffic on specified lengths of the trunk road should be prohibited and/or restricted because of works proposed on or near the road.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1), (4) and (7) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1), make this Order.

Title and commencement

1. The title of this Order is the A40 Trunk Road (Llandovery, Carmarthenshire to Trecastle, Powys) (Temporary Traffic Prohibitions & Restrictions) Order 2023 and this Order comes into force on 6 June 2023.

Interpretation

2. In this Order—

"exempted vehicle" ("cerbyd esempt") means:

By virtue of S.I. 1999/672, and section 162 of, and paragraph 30 of Schedule 11 to, the Government of Wales Act 2006 (c. 32), these functions are now exercisable by the Welsh Ministers in relation to Wales.

- (a) any vehicle being used for the purposes described in section 87 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1);
- (b) any vehicle being used for naval, military or air force purposes and being driven by a person for the time being subject to the orders of a member of the armed forces of the Crown, who is a member of the special forces—
 - (i) in response, or for practice in responding, to a national security emergency by a person who has been trained in driving at high speeds; or
 - (ii) for the purpose of training a person in driving vehicles at high speeds;

"special forces" ("lluoedd arbennig") means those units of the armed forces the maintenance of whose capabilities is the responsibility of the Director of Special Forces or which are for the time being subject to the operational command of that Director:

"the trunk road" ("y gefnffordd") means the A40 Raglan to Llandovery trunk road;

"works period" ("cyfnod y gwaith") means intermittent periods commencing at 00:01 hours on 6 June 2023 and ending when the temporary traffic signs for each period of works are permanently removed.

Prohibitions and restrictions

- **3.** No person may, during the works period, drive any vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, on the length of the trunk road specified in Schedule 1 to this Order.
- **4.** No person may, during the works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 40 miles per hour on the length of the trunk road specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.
- **5.** No person may, during the works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 10 miles per hour on the lengths of the trunk road specified in Schedules 2 and 3 to this Order.
- **6.** No person may, during the works period, use or permit the use of a vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, in such a way that it overtakes any other vehicle on the lengths of the trunk road specified in

Schedules 2 and 3 to this Order during such times as the restrictions specified in articles 4 and 5 are in operation.

Application

- 7.—(1) The prohibitions and restrictions in articles 3, 4, 5 and 6 apply only during such times and to such extent as indicated by traffic signs.
- (2) No speed limits imposed by this Order apply to an exempted vehicle.

Suspension

8. Any statutory provisions restricting the speed of vehicles on the lengths of the trunk road specified in Schedules 2 and 3 to this Order are suspended during such times as the restrictions specified in articles 4 and 5 are in operation.

Duration of this Order

9. The maximum duration of this Order is 18 months.

SCHEDULE 1 Temporary prohibition of vehicles

The length of the trunk road that extends from its junction with the A483 at Llandovery, Carmarthenshire to a point 5 metres north-west of the centre-point of its junction with Vicarage Road, Trecastle, Powys.

SCHEDULE 2 Temporary 40 mph or 10 mph speed limit and no overtaking

The length of the trunk road that extends from the permanent 30 mph speed limit sign at the eastern end of Llandovery to a point 1.1 kilometres south-east of the Carmarthenshire/Powys county boundary at Halfway.

SCHEDULE 3 Temporary 10 mph speed limit and no overtaking

The length of the trunk road that extends from its junction with the A483 at Llandovery to the permanent 30 mph speed limit sign at the eastern end of Llandovery.
