The A487 Trunk Road (The Old Dyfi Bridge, Machynlleth, Powys / Gwynedd) (Prohibitions & Waiting Restrictions) Order 2024

Made 5 March 2024

Coming into force 8 March 2024

The Welsh Ministers, as traffic authority for the A487 trunk road, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by sections 1(1), 2(1) and (2) and 4(2) of, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (1), make this Order.

The Welsh Ministers have consulted with the Chief Officers of Dyfed-Powys Police and North Wales Police and given public notice of their intention to make this Order in accordance with regulations 5(1) and 6(1) of the Secretary of State's Traffic Orders (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1990(2).

Title and Commencement

1. The title of this Order is the A487 Trunk Road (The Old Dyfi Bridge, Machynlleth, Powys / Gwynedd) (Prohibitions & Waiting Restrictions) Order 2024 and this Order comes into force on 8 March 2024.

Prohibition of Vehicles

2. Expect as provided article 5, no person maydrive or cause or permit any vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, to proceed on the length of the trunk road described in Schedule 1 to this Order.

Prohibition of Waiting at Any Time

3. Expect as provided article 6, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the sides of the lengths of the trunk road specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.

Restriction of Waiting (Between 23:00 and 08:00 Hours)

4. Expect as provided article 6, no person shall cause or permit any motor caravan or caravan drawn by a motor vehicle to wait between 23:00 hours and 08:00 hours on any day or days on the lengths of the trunk road specified in Schedule 3 to this Order.

Exemptions

- **5.** A person may drive or cause or permit any vehicle to proceed along the length of trunk road specified in article 2 where it is urgently necessary to do so for the purpose of moving livestock in consequence of flooding or the risk of flooding.
- **6.** A person may cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the sides of the lengths of the trunk road specified in article 3 for so long as may be necessary to enable—
 - (a) a person to board or alight from a vehicle;
 - (b) goods to be loaded on or unloaded from a vehicle;
 - (c) the vehicle to be used in connection with any of the following operations—
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the length of the trunk road; or
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration, or repair in, or in land adjacent to the lengths of the trunk road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or any electronic communications apparatus as defined in

paragraph 5 of Schedule 3A to the Communications Act 2003(1);

- (d) the vehicle to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory functions;
- (e) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes; or
- (f) the vehicle to stop when the person in control of it—
 - (i) is required by law to stop;
 - (ii) is obliged to stop in order to avoid an accident;
 - (iii) is prevented from proceeding; or
 - (iv) is acting upon the direction, or with the permission, of a police constable, police community support officer or civil enforcement officer.

SCHEDULE 1 Prohibition of vehicles

The length of A487 trunk road that extends from its junction with the A493 classified road, at a point 30 metres north of the Powys/Gwynedd border, to a point 43 metres south of the old Dyfi Bridge in the County of Powys.

SCHEDULE 2 Prohibition of waiting at any time

The length of northbound carriageway of the A487 trunk road that extends from a point 43 metres south of

the Powys/Gwynedd border to a point 60 metres south of the said border.

The length of the northbound carriageway of the A487 trunk road that extends from a point 65 metres south of the Powys/Gwynedd border to a point 141 metres south of the said border.

The length of northbound carriageway of the A487 trunk road that extends from a point 104 metres south of the Powys/Gwynedd border to a point 141 metres south of the said border.

The length of northbound carriageway of the A487 trunk road that extends from a point 168 metres south of the Powys/Gwynedd border to a point 186 metres south of the said border.

The length of southbound carriageway of the A487 trunk road that extends from a point 43 metres south of the Powys/Gwynedd border to a point 178 metres south of the said border.

SCHEDULE 3

Restriction of waiting for motor caravans or caravans drawn by motor vehicles between 23:00 and 08:00 hours

The length of A487 trunk road that extends from a point 80 metres south of the Powys/Gwynedd border to a point 104 metres south of the said border.

The length of A487 trunk road that extends from a point 141 metres south of the Powys/Gwynedd border to a point 168 metres south of the said border.
