Police Court Appeals.

A.G. -v- Kennerdale & Thompson.

Appeal against sentences of four months' imprisonment imposed on each of the appellants by the Police Court Magistrate on the 2nd July, 1985, in respect of a charge of having, in concert and complicity, stolen a night safe pouch containing, inter alia, nine hundred and fifty three pounds in cash.

DEPUTY BAILIFF: "We do not consider that the sentence imposed by the learned Magistrate was manifestly excessive. Your clients took the bag and they only wanted to take what you said they might — enough for a drink. It was open for them to take that when they found the money and then throw the bag away or drop it in somewhere, but they took it and they were determined to take the lot. We cannot find the sentence was wrong. The appeal is dismissed. Legal aid costs.
