The Bailiff: Having regard to the long period of time over which these acts of dishonesty took place, and having regard to the authorities, to which we have been referred, to the fact that no money was repaid, to the fact that there was this trust, although it is perfectly true an application came in 1976 and was refused, and even taking into account that the money appears to have been spent on living expenses and not in high-living, we cannot say that the conclusions asked for are wrong and therefore they are granted.
