We are taking into account, Mr. Habin, the fact that your client has somewhere to go immediately to work and we think that justice will be done if he is sentenced to six weeks' imprisonment which will enable him to be released today. We are putting your client on trust as we cannot bind him over as well (although I wish we could). The fact is that he has a job to go to and somewhere to sleep we hope that he keeps it.
