JUDG MENT

THE BAILIFF: The Court supports the view of the Crown Advocate that attacks on the police normally carry with them sentences of imprisonment; but the Court is going to agree with the suggestions of your Advocate, Fossey, that we can make a reduction in the actual sentences. They will be on your record; you are not going to serve them as they will be concurrent; but we are doing so for the spark of hope that you are going to change your ways and we want to encourage you. Therefore for that reason we are going to reduce the conclusions asked for to the figure suggested by your counsel; four months for count 1; nine months for count 2; six months for count 3; and four months for count 4, all concurrent with each other and concurrent with the sentence you are presently serving in the United Kingdom. We sincerely hope that when you come back to Jersey you will have turned over a new leaf and can start completely afresh.
