## JUDG MENT

THE BAILIFF: Whilst it is quite true that the seriousness of the offence is certainly something that the Court below is entitled to take into account, there are other considerations in granting bail and we have come to the conclusion, in view of the decision of the accused to plead not guilty, and in view of their clean records and of the fact that they can provide some money for bail, that this is a case where bail could be provided. We are therefore going to place you each on bail of £1,500. You are to report

weekly to the police either here or wherever you may go by arrangement. You are to surrender your passports and you are not to interfere with the witnesses. On those conditions you may be released on bail. You obviously want a little time to find it and you will have to stay in prison until you do, but the moment you find it you can go out on those conditions.
