JUDGHENT

COMMISSIONER LE CRAS: The Court initially orders that the Royal Court Acte of the 27th June, 1990, be amended by the Judicial Greffe, to provide for an arrest on wages at £25 per week.

I should like to say that we have noted the statement made in Bianchi -v- Gentili (12th July, 1990) Jersey Unreported, regarding the Court's discretion, and have also noted that no authorities were cited in that case, but that nevertheless the statement comes as a surprise to us. We think we have no alternative, in the absence of more lengthy argument, but to follow it.

We therefore propose to defer this summons until 10.00 a.m. on the 18th March, 1991, and if the application is maintained, we will expect to hear from the defendant on that occasion and to hear supporting evidence. For example, Mrs. Lang, a member of the Social Security Department, who will give evidence that the defendant has, in fact, attended five days a week, as he says. Costs will be in the cause.
