- 1 Count of obtaining services by false pretences (Count 1 of the Indictment).
- 6 Counts of obtaining credit by fraud (Counts 2 7, inclusive).
- 3 Counts of obtaining money by false pretences (Counts 8 10, inclusive).
- 3 Counts of receiving stolen property (Counts 11 13, inclusive).
- 3 Counts of forgery (Counts 14 16, inclusive).

PLEA:

Guilty

DETAILS OF OFFENCE:

Value of services/goods/cash obtained or attempted £1,636. Accused came to Island from U.K. with stolen cheque book on two week spree. Made off from at least seven different hotels without payment.

DETAILS MITIGATION:

Guilty plea; alcohol problem, divorced and financial problems as consequence. Claimed to have had good employment previous as tea-broker.

PREVIOUS CONVICTIONS:

Many for similar offences, mostly 1980-82 and 1988-91. Served previous sentences of imprisonment.

CONCLUSIONS:

18 Months concurrent each count.

SENTENCING AND OBSERVATIONS OF THE COURT:

Conclusions granted. No other observations.
