**JUDGMENT**

**THE BAILIFF:** We have examined this matter as if the licence had not been revoked because that is quite irrelevant to the consideration of this appeal. We have taken into account the fact that Mr. Turner called the police himself and that it was seven and three quarter years since his previous offence. Thirdly, we have taken into account that it doesn't appear that the advocate was called upon to address the Court as regards the
