One infraction of Article 36(1) of the Social Security (Jersey) Law, 1974.

**PLEA:** Facts admitted.

**DETAILS OF OFFENCE:**

Did not pay contributions for the period in which they were due. 28 employees involved = £6,400. Schedule in on time, but accompanying cheque was dishonoured on five occasions. Summons issued as a last resort.

**DETAILS OF MITIGATION:**

Plea of guilty. Good previous record of compliance.

**PREVIOUS CONVICTIONS:** None.

**CONCLUSIONS:** £300 plus £50 costs.

**SENTENCE AND OBSERVATIONS OF THE COURT:**

Conclusions granted. To retain and have the use of employees' contributions is, in the strictest terms, a breach of trust. Conclusions appropriately conservative in the light of available mitigation.
