Infraction of Article 14(1)(a) of the <u>Housing (Jersey) Law, 1949</u>: failing to comply with condition attached to consent of Housing Committee to assignment of balance of lease of a property, namely that a 3 bedroom cottage at rear of property should not, without the Committee's consent, be let to/occupied by persons neither approved by the Committee nor failing within categories set out in Regulation 1(1)(a)-(h) of the <u>Housing (General Provisions) (Jersey) Regulations, 1970</u>, and who had not filed particulars of an exempted transaction, under Regulation 5(1) of the said Regulations.

PLEA: Facts admitted (change of plea).

CONCLUSIONS: £2,000 fine; £500 costs.

SENTENCE: £1,000 fine; £500 costs.

## JUDGMENT

THE LIEUTENANT BAILIFF: Advocate Gould, for two reasons - one because there has been no profit motive and the other is the severe financial position in which your clients find themselves - we have decided to reduce the conclusions a little and so they are fined £1,000 with £500 costs. The Jurats are very much of the opinion that they should have two months in which to pay.
