PLEA: Facts admitted.

## **CONCLUSIONS:**

Charges 1, 3, 5, 7: fine of £175, or 2 weeks' imprisonment in default, on each charge.

Charges 2, 4, 6, 8: fine of £400, or 4 weeks' imprisonment in default, on each charge.

Sentences of imprisonment to run consecutively if need be.

TOTAL: Fine of £2,300 or 24 weeks' imprisonment; £100 costs.

## SENTENCE OF THE COURT:

Conclusions granted; fines plus costs to be paid off at £40 p.w. commencing 11th March, 1994.

THE LIEUTEMANT BAILIFF: We note that you have been contributing regularly since last October, which counts very much in your favour, and although we are going to fine you as asked by the Crown we are going to give you time to pay.

On counts 1, 3, 5 and 7, you are fined £175, or in default, two weeks' imprisonment consecutive, on each count. On counts 2, 4, 6 and 8, you are fined £400, or in default, four weeks' imprisonment consecutive, on each count, which makes a total of £2,300 or 24 weeks' imprisonment, plus £100 costs. The fines to be paid off at £40 per week commencing weekend of 11th March, 1994.
