Sentencing, following guilty plea, on 8th April, 1994, to:

1 count of illegal entry with intent (count 3 of the Indictment laid against the accused and a co-accused; counts 1 and 2 were laid against the co-accused alone, who was discharged from the prosecution on 8th April, 1994, following not guilty pleas, which the Crown accepted).

**AGE:** 47.

**PLEA:** Guilty.

**DETAILS OF OFFENCE:**

Found drunk in courtyard of hotel. Entered through window broken by co-accused against whom charges dropped. Nothing stolen but evidently rooms entered.

**DETAILS OF MITIGATION:**

22 weeks on remand already. Hopeless drunk.

**PREVIOUS CONVICTIONS:**

Appalling record going back 20 years - 7 in 1993. None for illegal entry.

**CONCLUSIONS:**

6 months' imprisonment, enabling accused to walk free.

**SENTENCE:**

Conclusions granted.

**JUDGMENT**

**THE DEPUTY BAILIFF:** But before I impose the Court's sentence I think I should say that you do have an appalling criminal record. The Court hopes that you will do your best to reform yourself and to stop this continuous offending which has led you into trouble for at least the last 20 years.

The Court therefore sentences you on Count 3 to 6 months' imprisonment; you have already served that time on remand and you are therefore discharged and may leave the Court.
