JUDGMENT

THE DEPUTY BAILIFF: On the basis of the Probation Report, the immediate feeling is that there is something wrong with this young man's mental state. It may not, in any way, affect our decision but we feel we should at least try - despite what he says, Miss Roscouet, - to obtain psychiatric and psychological reports, but he has to consent to both of them.

We would urge your client, Miss Roscouet, to take that option but if he does not, at least we have tried. We are going to remand the case for three weeks, and ask Dr. Faiz - if consent is granted by the accused (and if consent is necessary), for both the

psychiatric and the psychological reports to be prepared and to be forwarded to us as quickly as possible. Dr. Faiz already has a background report.

- 5 Bree, you are remanded in custody for three weeks. We hope you take advantage of the offer which has been made to you so that we can better understand your situation.
