The One-Way Traffic (Omagh) Order (Northern Ireland) 2016

Made - - - 8th July 2016

Coming into operation- -

1st August 2016

The Department for Infrastructure(**a**) makes the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by Article 4(1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation (Northern Ireland) Order 1997(**b**) and now vested in it(**c**).

The Department has consulted such persons as it considered appropriate in compliance with paragraphs 1 and 2 of Schedule 1 to that Order.

The Department has published a notice in compliance with paragraphs 1 and 3 of that Schedule.

No written objection or other representation has been received.

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as The One-Way Traffic (Omagh) Order (Northern Ireland) 2016 and shall come into operation on 1st August 2016.

Prohibition

2. A person shall not, except upon the direction or with the permission of a constable in uniform cause or permit any vehicle to proceed on the roads or lengths of road specified in Column 1 of Schedule 1 in a direction other than that specified in relation to those roads or lengths of road in Column 2.

Revocations

3. The Orders specified in Schedule 2 are revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

The effect of this Order is to introduce a one-way traffic system on Brook Street, Omagh for its entire length so that traffic can only proceed in an easterly direction.

This Order also revokes and re-enacts the provisions of the One-Way Traffic (Omagh) Order (Northern Ireland) 1986 (as amended) and includes an amended description for the item in respect of Market Street, Omagh.

Any person who acts in contravention of this Order shall be guilty of an offence under the Road Traffic Regulation (Northern Ireland) Order 1997 ("the Regulation Order") and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale (£1,000), in accordance with the Road Traffic Offenders (Northern Ireland) Order 1996 as amended by the Regulation Order.

Traffic signs indicating the effect of the Order will in due course be placed on the road.
