# **ROAD TRAFFIC**

# The A96 Trunk Road (Tyrebagger Junction Area) (Prohibition of Specified Turns) Order 2023

Made	-	-	21st June 2023
Coming into force	-	-	30th June 2023

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 1(1)(a) and 2(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(**a**) and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 1(1)(a) of that Act, they consider it expedient to make this Order for avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising.

The Scottish Ministers have complied with Parts II and III of the Secretary of State's Traffic Orders (Procedure) (Scotland) Regulations 1987(b).

#### Citation and commencement

**1.** This Order may be cited as the A96 Trunk Road (Tyrebagger Junction Area) (Prohibition of Specified Turns) Order 2023 and comes into force on 30 June 2023.

#### **Prohibition of specified turns**

**2.** No person may use, or permit the use of, any vehicle on the length of road specified in Part 1 of the schedule so as to make any turn specified in Part 2 of the schedule.

## Exemption

**3.** No U-turn prohibited by this Order applies to a vehicle while being used in an emergency for fire brigade, ambulance, police or coastguard purposes.

## SCHEDULE

Article 2

### PART 1

#### SPECIFIED LENGTH OF ROAD

That length of the A96 Craibstone – Inverness Trunk Road from a point of 822 metres or thereby west of its junction with the centre line of the road known as the B979 to Tyrebagger, Aberdeenshire, in a generally easterly direction to a point of 504 metres or thereby west of the point where it meets the circulation lanes of the Craibstone Roundabout, a distance of 2.2 kilometres or thereby.

## PART 2

#### SPECIFIED TURNS

1. All right turns from the eastbound carriageway of the A96 Craibstone – Inverness Trunk Road to the road known as the B979 to Tyrebagger, Aberdeenshire.

2. All right turns from the road known as the B979 to Tyrebagger, Aberdeenshire, to the eastbound carriageway of the A96 Craibstone – Inverness Trunk Road.

3. All U-turns.
