DECISION

- 1. The appellant has an appeal outstanding before the Upper Tribunal. By letter dated 14 March 2014 his legal representatives state that the appellant wishes to withdraw the appeal.
- 2. Rule 17 of the Tribunal Procedure (Upper Tribunal) Rules 2008 provides that a party may give notice of the withdrawal of its case or any part of it, subject to the consent of the Upper Tribunal. There is no provision for a party to withdraw the appeal before the Upper Tribunal. Therefore, the letter from the appellant's representatives can serve only as a notice of withdrawal of his case before the Upper Tribunal, to which the Upper Tribunal now consents.
- 3. The effect of the withdrawal of the appellant's case is that the decision of the Firsttier Tribunal dismissing his appeal stands. The appellant's appeal to the Upper Tribunal is dismissed.
