## DECISION AND CONSENT ORDER

## Background

1. This is an appeal against the decision of First-tier Tribunal Judge Herlihy which was promulgated on 10 January 2018. The decision was made following a hearing, on 19 December 2017, that was not attended by the appellant or a representative on his behalf.
2. The appellant appealed - and permission to appeal was granted - on the basis that notice of the hearing was sent to an incorrect address. The evidence before us establishes that this is likely to have been the case.

## Consent Order

3. Having heard submissions by Mr Aghayere on behalf of the appellant and Mr Duffy on behalf of the respondent;
4. And upon it having been agreed by Mr Duffy that if we were of the view that the appellant did not have notice of the hearing before the First-tier Tribunal on 19 December 2017 the decision should be set aside and remitted to the First-tier Tribunal notwithstanding that the appellant was deported to Nigeria on 28 March 2018;
5. In accordance with Section 39 of the Tribunal Procedure (Upper Tribunal) Rules 2008 we:
A. allow the appellant's appeal;
B. set aside the decision of the First-tier Tribunal; and
C. remit the appeal to the First-tier Tribunal to be heard afresh before a different judge.
