# **DECISION AND REASONS**

- 1. The Secretary of State is appealing against a decision of Judge of the First-tier Tribunal Mill, dated 7 September 2023, allowing an appeal by the respondent under the Immigration (Citizens' Rights Appeals) (EU Exit) Regulations 2020.
- 2. The central issue in contention before the First-tier Tribunal was whether the respondent was entitled to leave under the EUSS on the basis that she had been residing in the UK for a continuous qualifying period before the specified date of 31 December 2020.
- 3. At the start of the hearing, Mr Terrell conceded the appeal. He accepted that the respondent satisfied the necessary conditions under Appendix EU. With respect to whether the continuous qualifying period requirement had been met, which

was the issue that had been in contention, Mr Terrell conceded that it had by operation of subparagraph (c)(ii)(aa) of the definition of continuous qualifying period in Annex 1. Mr Terrell accepted that, in the light of this, the decision of the First-tier Tribunal should not be set aside.
