# **JUDGMENT**

**Employment Tribunals Rules of Procedure 2013 – Rule 21** 

No response having been presented by either respondent and on the information before the Employment Judge from the ET1 claim form and correspondence,

#### The Judgment of the Tribunal is that:

- 1. The claimant was employed by the first respondent, not the second respondent which is a non-trading company.
- 2. The first respondent has made unauthorised deductions from the claimant's wages in terms of £600.00 deductions and £554.00 non-payment, a total of £1,154.00 and is ordered to pay the claimant the gross sum of £1,154.00.
- 3. The first respondent has failed to pay the claimant's holiday entitlement and is ordered to pay the claimant the gross sum of £470.00.
- 4. The hearing listed on 21 August 2019 is cancelled.

The Employment Tribunals (Interest) Order 1990 provides that sums of money payable as a result of a judgment of an Employment Tribunal (excluding sums representing costs or expenses), shall carry interest where the full amount is not paid within 14 days after the day that the document containing the tribunal's written judgment is recorded as having been sent to parties.
