1. The Claimant's claim under section 23 of the Employment Rights Act 1996 that the Respondent has failed to pay wages due to the Claimant is well founded.
2. The Claimant's claim under regulation 30(1) of the Working Time Regulations 1998 that the Respondent has failed to pay the Claimant an amount due under Regulation 14(2) of those Regulations (holiday pay) is well founded.
3. The Respondent is ordered to pay to the Claimant $£ 1,295.65$ in this respect. Any amount which the Respondent lawfully deducts from the above amount by way of income tax, national insurance contributions or otherwise shall be treated to that extent as in payment of this order. In the absence of evidence to substantiate the lawfulness of such a deduction the gross amount specified shall be due under this Judgment to the Claimant.

## Schedule of Calculations

## Wages

The Claimant was not paid for March 2020 at the end of which the Claimant found other work.

The calculation is:
Pay for March 2020: $£ 1,386.67$
A week's pay in hand: $£ 320$
From the total of $£ 1,706.67, £ 1,250$ falls to be deducted being the total of payments already made by the Respondent on account of wages. This leaves a balance owing of $£ 456.67$.

Holiday pay
The Claimant is owed 118 hours holiday pay.
The calculation is:
$115 \times £ 7.11$ (normal hourly rate) $=£ 838.98$
