# JUDGMENT

- 1. The claimant was unfairly dismissed by the respondent. The respondent is ordered to pay the claimant £3,031.82 compensation for unfair dismissal.
- 2. The Employment Protection (Recoupment of Benefits) Regulations 1996 do not apply to this compensation.
- 3. The claimant is entitled to interest calculated at 8% per annum on any amount of this compensation that remains unpaid 14 days after the date of this judgment (per *Employment Tribunals (Interest) Order 2013 Art 3*)

### **Appendix: Calculations**

The claimant was 31 at the date of dismissal and had been employed by the respondent for over 2 years. Her gross weekly pay was £190.13. She has found alternative employment, but it has taken four months for her earnings to get up to the level she was previously earning.
