# **JUDGMENT**

- 1. The claimant's claim of unfair dismissal is well-founded and the respondent is ordered to pay to the claimant;
  - a. a basic award of £2280 and
  - b. a compensatory award of £1021.01.
- 2. The respondent was in breach of contract and the respondent is ordered to pay damages to the claimant in the sum of £468.31.
- 3. Pursuant to section 38 Employment Act 2002 the respondent is ordered to pay the claimant the sum of £760 being equivalent to 2 weeks wages.
- 4. The claim of discrimination is dismissed.
