5. The claim of pregnancy and maternity discrimination succeeds. The Respondent is ordered to pay to the Claimant the following: -

5.	Total compensation for discrimination	£22,142.99
4.	Interest on injury to feelings	£1552.41.
3.	Injury to feelings	£14,000.00
2.	Interest on the above	£346.36.
1.	Compensation for loss of earnings	£6244.22.

6. The Tribunal declares that the Respondent has failed to deal with the Claimant's flexible working request in a reasonable manner.
