The Claimant's claims of constructive unfair dismissal (s.95(1)(c) Employment Rights Act 1996 ('ERA') is well founded and is upheld.

The Claimant's claim of unauthorised deductions from wages (s.13 ERA) is well founded and is upheld.

The Claimant's claim of breach of regulation 13 of the Working Time regulations 1998 in relation to outstanding holiday pay is well founded and is upheld.

- 1. The Claimant is awarded:
 - (i) £7,716.00p (basic award)
 - (ii) £14,679.06p (compensatory award)
 - (iii) £7,211.54p (unauthorised deductions from wages)
 - (iv) £3,028.25p (unpaid accrued holiday pay)
