JUDGMENT

It is the unanimous judgment Tribunal that:-

- 1. The claimant's claim for unlawful deduction from wages for 98 hours unpaid breaks in the sum of £1,078 is not well founded and fails.
- 2. The claimant's claim that she was unfavourably treated because of something arising in consequence of disability when she was dismissed, pursuant to Section 15 Equality Act 2010 is well founded and succeeds.
- 3. The claimant's claim for failure to provide written particulars of employment pursuant to Section 1 Employment Rights Act 1996 is well founded and succeeds.

4. The case will proceed to a remedy hearing on Monday 25 November 2024 at Employment Tribunals, Alexandra House, 14 – 22 The Parsonage, Manchester, M3 2JA with an estimated length of hearing of one day starting at 10.00 am.
